On the 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2019 Stirling Council recognised the need to address climate change and declared a climate emergency.

The Scottish Government has set the target date as 2045 for net-zero<sup>2</sup> emissions of all green house gasses and Stirling Council is supporting this legislation with their Climate and Nature Emergency Plan.
